Somehow the first quarter of 2023 is done! AIA's Small Firm Exchange board and state reps have been discussing..

SFx state reps - best practices from existing small firm groups and how to replicate those models. Does your AIA Chapter have a small firm roundtable, committee, or exchange? Is there something they do well? Are they offering virtual programs that could be opened to other chapters? Let us know!

Implementing EDI can be challenging for small firms, especially sole practitioners. SFx shared ideas including seeking out diverse partners, mentoring outside your firm, participating in K-12 architecture education programs, and supporting MBE. Does your small firm have an EDI success story?

At our first all-call of the year, SFx met with the Young Architects Forum (YAF) - a national committee modeled on the College of Fellows to support architects licensed ten years or less. They have quarterly publications and connect young architects across the local, state, and national AIA network. They shared their 2023 priorities: advocating for change, educating for impact, and diversifying for the future.

We look forward to collaborating with them on pathways to small firm ownership, hiring strategies for small firms, and starting a sole practitioner firm, among other topics.
